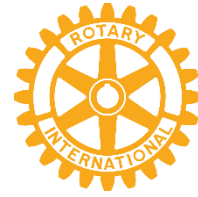

Rotary's Foreign Extension

It is some task to introduce the great ideals of Rotary and the unique customs of Rotary into forty nations differing from each other in industrial development, customs, habits and business practices, and speaking every tongue used by civilized men. It is some task to construct and institute a world-wide international organization that can be administered as an international organization among forty such nations.

There is nothing in the recorded history of the world to indicate that such things can be done successfully. Rotarians, however, are men of faith and optimism and determination. They know that the world needs Rotary and they propose that the world shall have Rotary. The ways will be discovered, and the means must be forthcoming.

Rotary is the world's practical ideal. In the spirit of love, it will construct and establish – neither palaces or prisons – but righteous relations among men of each community, among men of each nation, and at the same time among men of all nations. Rotary is the silken cord which will pull ashore the cables of international relations.

Funds greater than are available out of the present income of the association are needed to carry on Rotary's foreign extension. It is a work that must be done without further delay, but it must be with the greatest care and wisdom. The International Board and the Committee on Foreign Extension have authorised the acceptance of contributions of funds for this work. Are there Rotarians who want to make a contribution to the peace of the world and the success of mankind?
